## Duiding

Een kwaadwillende kan de kwetsbaarheden misbruiken om een Denial-of-Service (DoS) te veroorzaken, zich verhoogde rechten toe te kennen en/of toegang te krijgen tot gevoelige gegevens.

## Oplossingen
